

Do we have a mutual interest in truth and justice?

3. Was Fox seized and taken out of the courtroom by force of arms? -- **YES**

4. Does the 4th Amendment allow for such conduct***? -- **NO**

*** Grounds for arrest are:

- a) warrant in hand
- b) felony committed within sight of an officer
- c) breach of the peace creating a riot

5. Absent lawful authorities, what is such a seizure called? -- **KIDNAPPING**

Bascom W. Bentley III, Elmer C. Beckworth, Jr., Gordon Keith LeMaire, Joe Evans, and the unidentified bailiff, who are educated, trained, paid, and sworn to uphold the law, acted in collusion in direct defiance of the supreme law of the land, The Constitution for The United States of America and therein violated Texas Penal Code clearly achieving an objective of eliminating my right of access to a criminal court case open to the people.
